Reading, Language Arts, & Social Studies

In reading, students
have worked on skills, including
generalizing, cause and effect, compare
and contrast, facts and opinions, and
drawing inferences. In written
composition, students completed their
study of narratives, responses to
literature, and summaries. They've been
learning about figurative language.
Students will soon start working on an
earth science informational report and
pioneer journals,

In social studies, students completed units for explorers, California missions, and ranchos. Student teams collaborated to build missions, in class. Currently, students are building models of a pioneer covered wagon. Class projects are designed to capture students' interest, and contain a variety of reading, writing, listening, multimedia, and technology-integrated activities.

Mathematics & Science

Students have learned about multi-digit multiplication, long division, fractions, coordinate planes, area/perimeter, and math transformations.

In science, students studied life science with a variety of hands-on labs. They've begun their earth science unit, and are currently studying minerals and rocks. Several students participated in the Science Fair at school. Great job!

Other students opted to create a Let's Invent Project to share with their classmates.

Other Areas

Students continue to work with their first grade buddies in class and the computer lab. Fourth graders participated in their drama program, "Casey at the Bat." Students continue to participate in art, library, music, and P.E. each week. They go to the computer lab for curriculum-integrated activities on Tuesdays, and there are carefully-crafted activities using computers at least twice twice a week in the classroom.
